Planning for Fall

We are working through budgeting and staffing, and it is also the time of year when we begin thinking about class lists for Fall. To that end, we always provide an opportunity for parents to provide input that can help us make the best class placement for your child(ren). Even if you have already had a conversation on this topic with your home-room teacher, **we need you to complete the Google Form provided in the link below to ensure that information is considered**, as sometimes teachers go on medical leave etc. Please recognize that the intention is **not** to pick your child's teacher for next year, but to provide information about your child that helps us make the best decision possible based on both your input, staff considerations, class demographics, and so on. Please note - This is absolutely **optional** to complete, but if you want to do so, it can be found on the RVS school website, under the Newsletter tab/Other Office Communication Tab, and is called [Information Relative to Student Placement Form—Spring 2024](#). We would ask that all these forms be submitted no later May 16, 2024

We are planning to provide class placement information to families in the June report card.

Combined Classrooms

Our predicted student enrollment for Fall 2024 is approximately 530 students. We continue to have low Kindergarten numbers and this ripples its way up over the years. The way these numbers fall in various grades has us in a position of seeing combined classrooms in a number of grades again this coming year. We saw a similar trend this year, and it is likely something we will continue to see in future, unless there is a significant increase in student enrollment across most grades. There are both pros and cons to this unavoidable way of doing business... Combined classes offer leadership opportunities for older students and good modeling for younger students. There are more opportunities for concept review, and literacy and numeracy is taught on a continuum - as it should be - meeting students where they are at, rather than teaching them concepts tied to chronological age versus readiness to learn. This is something we promote in all classrooms, but it becomes a truly lived concept in a combined classroom. Students in combined classrooms learn to become more independent learners which positively affects their ability to be successful throughout school and life. At times there are concerns about same age peer connections, the teaching of 2 Science/Social Studies curriculums, and other worries. We are looking at creative ways to address these concerns, as we face this new reality of combined classes. We are considering some unique strategies to bring same age students together in classes like Library and the YES Program, as well as possibly during the SS/SC core blocks. We are also hoping to provide more Educational Assistance in these classrooms when possible, and we do take teacher preparation time into consideration as well. If you have any questions or concerns about combined classrooms, please feel free to contact your child's teacher or an administrator at any time.





After a busy year dedicated to planning, fundraising, and envisioning the future, we were able to open our doors in November of 2022.

Located on centre street and walking distance from the schools, THE DEN offers diverse entertainment options, including multiple activity areas, study spaces, karaoke, musical instruments, a "canteen" snack bar, and comfortable seating. Through regular drop-in nights and events, THE DEN has welcomed hundreds of young individuals, creating a vibrant and secure community hub. Our dedicated program staff and volunteers strive to connect with each youth, ensuring a welcoming and supportive atmosphere.

A powerful testament to the impact of THE DEN is the story of a young guitarist who, empowered by the group's encouragement, overcame their hesitation to perform regularly at Open Circles. Another youth, facing challenges due to ADHD, discovered acceptance and support from both volunteers and peers.

From solitary phone-focused moments to forging friendships, THE DEN has transformed the lives of youth who initially entered alone. Our mission is clear – to foster relationships, instill confidence, and provide a safe haven for making friends, building connections and having a great time in the process.

THE DEN is one of the many projects of Greenwood Neighbourhood Place. Keeping THE DEN open and well-maintained ensures it remains a vital resource for the community.
